I. BACKGROUND

As placed on the Agenda (Item 5) for September 04, 2018 Commission Meeting. Commissioner W. White requested that the Harbor Commission review and discuss the possibility of hosting the Visitors Bureau Information Center (V.B.I.C.) at 201 Citizens Dock Road. Previous used as the Englund Marine retail outlet. After a full discussion the Harbor Commission voted (5-0-0) to approve further research by Harbor Staff.

On the September 18, 2018 Agenda (Item 6) The Commission discussed the mechanics of preparing the building in advance of extending an invitation the V.B.I.C. Harbormaster C. Helms reported ongoing discussions with potential partners for use of the building.

On the October 02, 2018 Agenda (Item 4). Additional discussion of preparing the Old Englund Marine building in advance of offering an invitation to V.B.I.C. Commissioner Stone suggested the Commission direct staff to provide for a more detailed reporting. Commission directed staff to issue a report with a building layout, infrastructure needs (restrooms, upgrades, remodeling, etc.), and partner possibilities.

Since that directive the following (4) four (Oct. 16, 2018, Nov. 06 & 20, 2018 and finally Dec. 04, 2018) Commission meetings with Canceled. The Meetings of December 18, 2018 or January 07, 2019 did not have this item on the Agenda.

II. STAFF UPDATE

Have made calls and visited with local contractors to obtain estimates. The only company to reply was George Mayer of G.R. Construction Inc. We walked the entire site and discussed replacement requirements per DNC Building and ADA Codes. We also wanted to make a few upgrades to improve the overall visual impact of the exterior and interior. We may have missed some items, and possibly included items that may be considered extraneous. The attached estimate is ONLY an estimate.

As of today, Staff is not fully cognizant of whom the partners of this project will include. We have added suggestions from Commissioners and others in the community, as to what businesses we may wish to include.

III. STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends that the Commission review the documents. Then advise Staff of what they would prefer to keep, modify or delete. In the near future, we will have a much clearer understanding of our potential partners and then be ready to accommodate their requirements.

Commissioner White requested this item because there was some discussion at the Chamber about them looking at the old Englund Marine building as their office space. Commissioner White went on to state that this would be a good opportunity to look at other partners for the building who need space, and sharing the space would be a cost savings to all partners. Additional tenants could be the Visitor's Bureau, the Redwood Conservancy, USFS, and others. The building could become an inter-agency facility. Charlie Helms reminded the Commissioners that the bathroom facilities will need to be addressed which would need to be ADA accessible. Bringing in an ADA

mobile restroom facility would be less expensive. Commissioner Phillips inquired about payments from these agencies. Charlie Helms explained that every tenant pays on a percentage of sales basis, so their gift shop sales would be part of that. The Harbor could also move their gift shop into that building. Charlie Helms stated the Harbor would have to redo the floors and paint the interior, the roof and exterior are in good shape.

4. Report on potential cost range for Harbor District to assist in placement of dock for floating tree holiday decoration. Review and direct staff as needed

Lane Tavasci explained the process to place a dock for the floating Christmas tree. The dock is not suitably stable and making electricity available would require running the conduit underwater which would be quite expensive. Lane discussed alternatives to accommodate Christmas decorations; place the tree on the end of the Tally Ho dock which already has power in place and would need a barricade of sorts to keep the sea lions away, or ask the fleet if they would be interested in decorating their boats for the season. The Harbor Commissioners discussed other alternatives and then asked that further information be brought back to the next Commission meeting.

Public Comment: <u>Linda Sutter</u> suggested that the Security Officer for the Harbor could patrol the docks during the time the lights are on display and also suggested a walkabout type of display and solar lights would be a good addition.

 Update on the progress of seeking funding for the Economic Development Projects at the Crescent City Harbor District. Mr. Arden Shank and CEO Helms will report on progress of locating funding opportunities

Charlie Helms introduced Arden Shank who is a Community Development Consultant contracted by the Harbor to provide an overview of funding potentials for the Harbor's major projects. Arden Shank shared his background and experience; and then discussed the different funding opportunities for the Harbor projects. There are basically four funding streams to consider; grants, conventional loans, New Markets Tax Credits, and Opportunity Funds. The Crescent City area has been identified as an Opportunity Zone and is eligible to use Opportunity funds if it finds investors who are interested in investing in their projects. Opportunity Funds are capital gains that need to be reinvested to provide tax benefits to the investors. New Markets Tax Credits are designed to increase the flow of capital to businesses and low-income communities by providing a modest tax incentive to private investors. For investors to invest the project must be a revenue-

generating project because the investors will expect their investments to be returned. Traditional loans and grants will also be part of funding packages; it will take a combination of funding sources to bring the projects together and the total project funding must be in place before construction begins. Commissioner Stone asked about the timeframe for putting these funding packages together. Arden Shank replied it would be about two or three years for the projects that the Harbor is pursuing. The three projects could be looked at separately for funding, but again the complete funding must be in place before construction of each project. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Shank for the information and look forward to the projects getting started.

- 6. Discussion about researching the possibility of hosting the Visitors Bureau Information center at 201 Citizens Dock Road. Discussion about mechanics of preparing the old Englund Marine building in advance of extending an invitation to the Visitors Bureau to operate a facility at the Harbor District.

Listen to presentation and Discuss Commissioner Stone distributed a mailer that will be sent to the voters in the county in regards to Measure C and they are developing flyers to be posted. A fundraiser is planned to raise money for Measure C promotion. Commissioner Ramsey reported that signs are being delivered and plans for forums are underway.

Review, discuss strategy and direct staff if action is needed Commissioner Stone reported that the annual payment for the USDA Disaster loan was just made in the amount of \$260,303.22. Public Comment: <u>Linda Sutter</u> asked about accessing the Harbor's financials which she wasn't able to access on the website. Charlie Helms stated he would get the reports for her.

10. CEO Report

Charlie Helms reported on the renewal of the Coast Guard Mooring Lease, the ground lease is \$1 per year and the mooring lease is an annual amount of almost \$26,000. Charlie also met with Senator McGuire's staff to advise them on the Harbor's economic development plans and talked about the progress with the Tsunami Experience/Vertical Evacuation Center. Charlie also informed the Commissioners about a testimonial that the Harbor received which will be used for future marketing and outreach.

4. Discussion about researching the possibility of hosting the Visitors Bureau Information center at 201 Citizens Dock Road. Discussion about mechanics of preparing the old Englund Marine building in advance of extending an invitation to the Visitors Bureau to operate a facility at the Harbor District.

Commissioner Stone inquired about Item #5 and asked for background information. Lane Tavasci stated that Captain Shon Nichols inquired about the building at 201 Citizens Dock Road for a restaurant. Captain Nichols was asked to submit a proposal for discussion by the Commissioners. Commissioner White expressed concern about this intended proposal because previously the Board had agreed to pursue the building use for a visitor center with several interested partners. Commissioner White went on to state that the intended proposal should not be considered until the previous action that the Board has agreed to pursue be fully explored. Commissioner Ramsey and Commissioner Stone are in agreement to table Item #5.

Public Comment: <u>Sarah Caron</u>, Executive Director of the Crescent City Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Bureau, was invited to share her thoughts. Sarah stated that the Chamber and Visitor Bureau is very excited for the opportunity to have their agencies at the Harbor location and have been working towards that goal. The visibility, parking, accessibility and location are optimal for visitors to stop at this location. This is a potential to bring in up to 500 visitors to the Harbor on a daily basis during the summer season. Sarah is hopeful for the prospects to find partnerships in the building which will create an income to the Harbor. <u>Eileen Cooper</u> stated that at the public input session for the Strategic Plan a visitor center was just one idea and the Commissioners should take an opportunity to explore other possibilities.

Charlie Helms stated that the Harbor should continue down the path of partner possibilities for the building to be a visitor center and information center. Commissioner Stone suggested that the topic of discussion is to direct staff regarding the preparation of the old Englund Marine building in advance of any decisions. The Commissioner agreed to direct staff to prepare a report containing information on preparing the building for use and bring the information to the next Commission meeting. The report should contain a building layout, infrastructure needs (restrooms, upgrades, remodeling, etc.), and partner possibilities.

5. Appoint Ad Hoc Committee to discuss proposal from Captain Shon to lease the Old Englund Marine Building at 201 Citizens Dock. Choose Commissioners to serve on Ad Hoc Committee to discuss proposal for a restaurant at 201 Citizens Dock Road.

On a motion by Commissioner Stone, seconded by Commissioner White and on a 4-0-1 vote the Crescent City Harbor District Board of Commissioners approved tabling this item.
